WHAT'S IT ALL ABOUT?

This course is a must for ALL health care professionals who provide services to residents with dementia. There is a continuing need for caregivers who are trained to provide appropriate, competent and sensitive direct care to dementia residents. Following successful completion of this course, participants are one step closer to receiving their certified dementia practitioner (CDP®) certification.

#### **Course Goals:**

- To provide fundamental education on dementia and dementia care;
- To enhance the quality of life of dementia patients through educating care providers;
- To foster sensitivity and respect for the dementia patient;
- To teach communication techniques; and
- To provide sensitive approaches for assisting patients with activities of daily living (ADL).

Participants will:

- Have an understanding of dementia and identify common causes of aggressive, repetitive and sundowning behaviors in older adults;
- Describe behavioral interventions that may be used to prevent, reduce or eliminate difficult care situations;
- Describe challenges related to caregiver stress and utilize stress reduction techniques; and
- Learn alternative activity interventions.

**SEMINAR FACULTY** Danielle Micale, MHA, LNHA, CTRS, CDP, CADDCT, CDCM, holds a bachelor's degree in recreational therapy and psychology and a master's in health care administration. She is a licensed nursing home administrator, certified therapeutic recreation specialist, a certified dementia practitioner and a certified dementia care trainer. She is currently the vice president of corporate training for the National Council of Certified Dementia Practitioners (NCCDP) as well as a consultant with Rutgers University Behavioral Research and Training Institute.
